She was one of the first therapists in Wales to train in Sensory Integration and was a treating therapist in the UK SenITa research project and Deputy Lead OT for Wales and normative data collector for the global EASI project. In addition Beverley provides mentorship for those with an interest in Sensory Integration and was co-founder of the South Wales Sensory Integration specialist group for 11 years.

She has many years experience in environmental adaptations, liaising with architects, surveyors and suppliers to ensure the client's needs are met.
